

#### **GOSPEL MEDICAL MISSIONARY MINISTRY**

Much has happened since I last reported. Dwayne Lemon and his wife came to Ukiah November 3 – 17 to train us how to do medical missionary work. We met every night except Fridays and Sabbaths, 25 of us in all, some from Ukiah church and some from Hopland. What a training that was! It was like taking a whole quarter of school in two weeks! He used the Bible and Spirit of Prophecy as his textbooks. I took notes and typed up everything he presented including the Bible texts and the Spirit of Prophecy counsel - 81 pages in all.

A free Community program entitled "Take Charge of Your Health" by Dwayne Lemon is being planned for February 2 – 9 at the Hopland Village Church (51 Hwy 175 Hopland). Each evening Dwayne will present a health topic and, during the day, he will take a church member with him to do Health coaching with those who are coming to the meetings. If it goes well, we would like to have another community outreach like this in Ukiah. If you are interested in going, contact www.hoplandchurch.org/takecharge.

In preparation for the coming meetings, the group is meeting at Ukiah church every Sabbath afternoon at 4:30pm. We study a topic of the Bible to make sure we really understand it well enough to share it with others. After that, we study a disease. We learn all we can about a disease, its causes, how to prevent it and how to cure it, using natural remedies.

Meanwhile, we have had the privilege of continuing to help people we have helped before. One woman needed her kitchen tile repaired. One man needed a new bed put together, repairs on his walls and a good cleaning of his refrigerator. Another woman needed a filter changed in her home and just was happy to be visited. As you can see, if you can clean a refrigerator or do repairs in a home or cut grass, etc. and are willing to use those talents for others, then you can be a medical missionary (not everyone is trained in the medical part...much of this ministry deals with "help bands", just helping those we find that have a need.)

Anyone is welcome to our Sabbath afternoon meetings, so come and share what you know, and let's learn together.

### From Spark to Flame: Bringing Blacksmithing to Local Pathfinders

At the 2014 Oshkosh Camporee, Scot Brunner was among the first group ever taught blacksmithing at a Pathfinder event, and his enthusiasm led him to stay on as an assistant instructor that same week. His passion for the craft continued to grow through his involvement with Southern Adventist University's blacksmithing club, Southern Smiths. In the summer of 2015, Scot began teaching blacksmithing at Camp Au Sable, where he met Danae. The following year, Scot's brother joined the camp staff and met his future wife, Lily Davis, who wrote the Blacksmithing Honor at just 16 years old.

In August, Scot and Danae were among 35 instructors at the International Pathfinder Camporee in Gillette, Wyoming, leading what became the largest hands-on blacksmithing event for young people in the United States. Over 800 Pathfinders participated, crafting both a Frederick's Cross and an S-hook to earn their honor requirements. Although Scot came to instruct, he soon found himself being trained-in to lead the event and took over as site director each day. In order to bring blacksmithing to Pathfinders on the West Coast, Scot and Danae brought back three forges and all of the essential equipment.

On January 20, they held their first training session under the church awning, preparing a

dedicated team of instructors including Andrew Corbett, Jeremy Malin, Rick Nelson, Jordan Pastor, Luis Pastor, Eric Kablanow, and Wayne Kablanow. Their setup accommodates 18 students at once, with six instructors each supervising three students.

Looking ahead, Scot and Danae will work with the Ukiah Timberwolves on February 6 to master the honor curriculum and safety procedures. The Pathfinders will then put their knowledge into practice on February 20, crafting their own pieces and carrying forward this meaningful tradition of metalworking. 

# Let's Get Acquainted!

This month we are introducing a delightful family, Luke and Stella Kang and their almost two-year old son, Milo. We are so happy that God directed them to set up their home and ministry in Ukiah. If you have not met them yet, you are in for a great opportunity!

Both of them will be answering the following questions: Where were you living prior to Ukiah? They both answered Loma Linda. This is where Luke took his medical training and Family Practice residency program.

# How did God lead your individual paths to become one?

Stella: We saw each other first in Michigan about ten years ago. God re-connected us again when I was recovering my relationship with God after almost giving up on all relationships. Luke read my testimony online. Concerned, he reached out to me and this became a new relationship for us.

Luke: We first met in high school when Stella visited my church. We went to different universities. When I was in Loma Linda, I saw an article that Elder Ted Wilson shared about Stella. This led me to re-connect with her. We haven't stopped talking since.



### Which teacher inspired you the most, and how?

Stella: I cannot think of a teacher who inspired me the most.

Luke: There were lots of inspiring teachers. A role model I looked up to as a man of God was Dr. Jeff Cho, possibly one of the smartest in medical school and residency who chose Family Practice. He is now doing missions overseas with his family.

### How did you choose your profession?

Luke: I wanted to choose a challenging speciality that would allow me to also have an avenue to people through ministry. ### Where is the most interesting place you have traveled?

I have been to other countries too, but it was usually a packaged tour, rather than being on our own. ### A Lesson from God's Creation

In nature, as in *The Great Controversy*, deceptions are created to accomplish a goal. A group of nudibranchs, known as sea slugs, pull off one of nature's most fascinating weapon thefts. Many animals living in the sea use nematocysts to catch prey. Animals with nematocysts include sea anemones, jellies (formerly known as jellyfish), hydroids, and many others. All of these animals are predated upon by nudibranchs, which then pull off one of the most amazing thefts in nature, as they have found a way to protect themselves from the stinging-filled nematocysts and, at the same time, use it for their means.

I will use one common nudibranch in our tide pools in Albion to show how they work with nematocysts. The Nudibranch *Aeolidia papillosa*, also known as the Shag-rug Nudibranch, often feeds on *Anthopleura Elegantissima*, the Aggregating Anemone. When the slug wishes to feed, it rears up on the back of its foot and then plunges its face into the anemone, biting off and swallowing as much of the tentacles as possible. Because the nematocyst of the anemone fires upon contact, injecting poison into the prey or repelling an attacker, the nudibranch mitigates the poison or keeps the nematocyst from firing. There is evidence they do both; they often have a mucus lining inside the mouth and gut that keeps many of the nematocysts from firing, and they also have cells that have a chitinous layer of protection, much like a fingernail that protects the nudibranch from the poison and also keeps the nematocysts from firing. The Shag-rug Nudibranch then takes the nematocysts that have not been fired and surrounds them with a mucosal layer in the gut in a further attempt to keep them from firing and injecting poison. These packets, now known as kleptocnidae, are somehow migrated through the cell walls and stored on the end of the cerata (gills) for defense.

How this occurs is still being studied, and the mechanism is not entirely understood. Scientists have discovered that the Shag-rug Nudibranch also uses stored kleptocnidae to attack the Aggregating Anemone when the Shag-rug Nudibranch is feeding on it. Thus, the nudibranch uses the stored nematocysts from one anemone to attack another of the same species to gain an advantage in feeding.
